Country dancing champions!

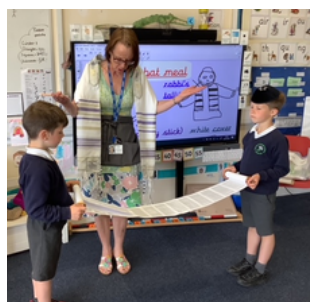

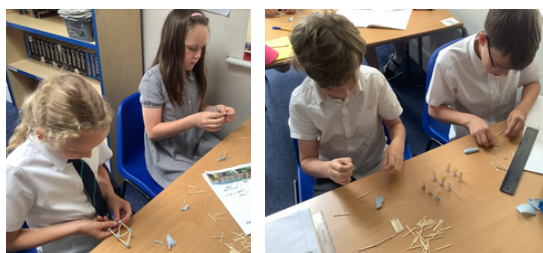


Year 1 children try Shabbat food

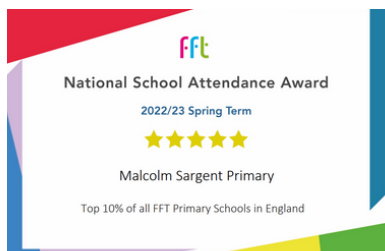

Year 4 pupils build bridges in Science



In their science lessons this term, our Year 4 children have been learning about bridges, the strength of shapes and how a triangle is commonly used to provide structure and stability. They studied truss bridges around the world and then turned their hand to making small replicas, using match sticks and Blu Tak. Not only did they learn about construction, it also hugely tested their patience and perseverance with such small materials: great for developing their fine motor skills!



National attendance award winners!

We were delighted to receive two national school attendance awards which celebrated the fact that our pupils' attendance is in the top 10% of all FFT primary schools in England. Thank you to our parent community with your support with this. Good attendance is crucial to children's academic progress, relationship development with their peers and their wellbeing.

Our hard-working pupils and staff were thrilled that our mammoth Coronation entries into the Joyce Burton Trophy were awarded top spot! The Westminster Abbey replica, flat street party, crown and Union flag were displayed at the Royal British Legion Family fun day on the Rec. It was fantastic to see so many current and former pupils. Nature Area bug village created

The Nature Club (run by Miss Blades) this term has already made a big impression at our 'Sanctuary'. The nature area at the bottom of our field near the wildflower meadow is now home to a bug hotel village, providing much-needed habitats. The Nature Club also got stuck into some weeding as well having a scavenger hunt, making and comparing tree rubbings, creating leaf rubbing art and enjoying an end-of-term picnic for the club to take in the much-improved surroundings.

Engineer inspiration from local company

We were delighted to welcome local industry visitors to inspire our children with the world of work so they can see how what they learn in primary school helps build their understanding of a particular subject and beyond into careers. Year 1 enjoyed a STEM morning, led by Perkins/Caterpillar engineers. The children were shown how ideas are transformed into everyday essentials. They then were tasked with working in their teams to design and make a bridge that had to be wide, strong and tall, spanning a 'ferocious' river.

RE visit for Year 2

As part of their RE topic on Islam, Year 2 enjoyed a visit from Zara Nargis, a teacher at a Peterborough school who is also a practising Muslim. The children were full of questions about what it's like going on Hajj (an annual pilgrimage to Mecca, which takes place annually). The children were thoroughly engrossed in all she had to say, and she was really impressed with the Year 2 pupils with their behaviour, friendliness, prior knowledge and respect for religions that may be different from their own.



Art Exhibition

Our annual Art Exhibition was a great success and a wonderful way to celebrate the breadth of art produced by children across the school. Officially opened by Deputy Mayor Marion Pitt, thank you to everyone who came along to support the event and applaud the work of our talented artists on display! The opening ceremony also featured singing by the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 choirs, representatives of "Friends of Nyansakia" charity, parents, past staff members and a special goodbye to Mr Peach and Mrs Brown (The mastermind behind the event's fabulous art displays).

Mr Peach is leaving us after 22 years at our school. After retiring from class teaching here in 2009, he formed a powerful musical partnership with Mrs Mills. As a keen (and quite brilliant!) musician, he has supported our choirs, singing assemblies and teaching piano for the last 14 years. He has decided the time is right for him to retire from this musical role with us and is turning his attention to dedicate more time to the charity of which he is a trustee. Thank you to all children who took part in the dress down day in June and donations for the Friends of Nyansakia charity that is raising money for a new kitchen to provide children with nutritious meals. The school currently use the kitchen below to cook a meal for 900 each each day. The dress down day raised £686, a good way towards the target of £5,500 for a new kitchen.

A huge thank you to our PTFA for funding the visit for us.



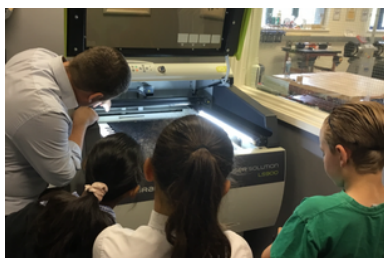
A Beary good time in Foundation Stage!

Our Green Team has been busy harvesting their crops after the lovely sunny weather ripened the home-grown produce. Over the past three weeks, the pupils have been taking home radishes, carrots, lots of potatoes, mint, rosemary bush samplings, garlic and some strawberries (although we don't believe they made it home!)

The children have been fantastic at helping to water our bee friendly flowers, keeping on top of the weeds, learning about the British meadows and wild flowers and creating leaf art; what an amazing Green Team we have had this year!

Sun powered art with a Cyanotype workshop for our Year 6s

Our Year 6s, took part in a Cyanotype workshop organised by Mrs Brown and delivered by illustrator and author Beach Evans. A mix of art, science and history, the children were following in the footsteps of Sir John Herschel and Anna Atkins who created the first 'photographs'. Using simple equipment and methodical steps, the children were fascinated at the process of making early photographs before the invention of the camera (and the mobile phone!). It is with many thanks to The Stamford Arts Society and their kind donation that the children were able to take part in this exciting workshop, something that they ordinarily wouldn't experience.



Going Swimmingly!

Terrific work by Miss Stewart and the swimming staff team has culminated in excellent achievement by the Year 5 children. We are still catching up on the backlog of swimming teaching caused by the pandemic which is so critical, living in an area with so many areas of open water and water activities. We have been delighted with how much progress has been achieved in this confidence-boosting life skill!

89% of our Year 5 pupils can now confidently swim at least 25m, 90% use a range of strokes and 87% perform a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. Well done to everyone involved!



Church visit for Year 4



As part of their RE study on Christianity, our Year 4 classes were welcomed into All Saints Church to learn about its different features and their use (such as the font).

They also explored the meaning of the amazing stained glass windows and found out about why baptism is important to Christians.

Stamford athletics meet



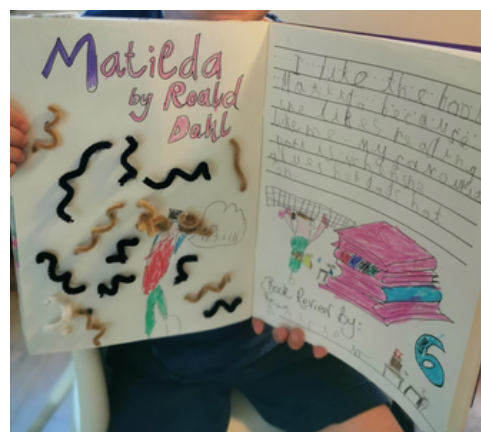

Our beloved Mrs Brown is retiring!

Mrs Brown joined Malcolm Sargent over 20 years ago as a parent volunteer and we have been extremely lucky to have had her as an integral part of the school's team since then. Ms Williams, another veteran teacher, has her first memories of Sue as the photocopy volunteer with her son a very young George Brown crouched by her side back in 2003! In 2004, Mrs Brown was employed as a Teaching Assistant until 2007 when she added receptionist/admin assistant to her job role with us. In 2009 Sue qualified as a HLTA and worked in that role teaching across the whole school until in 2018 she was promoted to Art Teacher. Mrs Brown even won HLTA of the year in 2016!



To say that Mrs Brown has inspired children is an understatement. She has crafted and shaped our incredibly ambitious and varied art curriculum, highly praised during our last Ofsted inspection and introduces the children to a huge number of art mediums such as clay, tie-dye, weaving, relief rubbing and Phulkari sewing. Mrs Brown has worked tirelessly to make sure the children have the most exciting and engaging lessons, working long hours to prepare and create incredible exemplars for the pupils to marvel at. After-school clubs have been a huge part of Mrs Brown's work with children, including art clubs, photography clubs and creating props for various school plays.

Mrs Brown has always been heavily involved in our wider community, organising our application to many art competitions and local/national events such as the creation of the clay poppies for the WW1 'Lest We Forget' commemoration, artwork for Holocaust Memorial Day and the Joyce Burton Trophy. This year, the incredible Westminster Abbey replica was Mrs Brown's art club's entry into the Joyce Burton Trophy; we were delighted to be crowned winners!



Many of you probably won't know but Mrs Brown used to be a synchronised swimmer and has competed for Great Britain internationally! She used this expertise and led our swimming lessons for many years, teaching children this crucial life skill.

I hope you will all join us in thanking Sue for her time at Malcolm Sargent. She will always be a well-loved part of our team but in her own words, "It's now time for me to pursue other adventures and have more of a work/life balance - i.e. no work, more life."

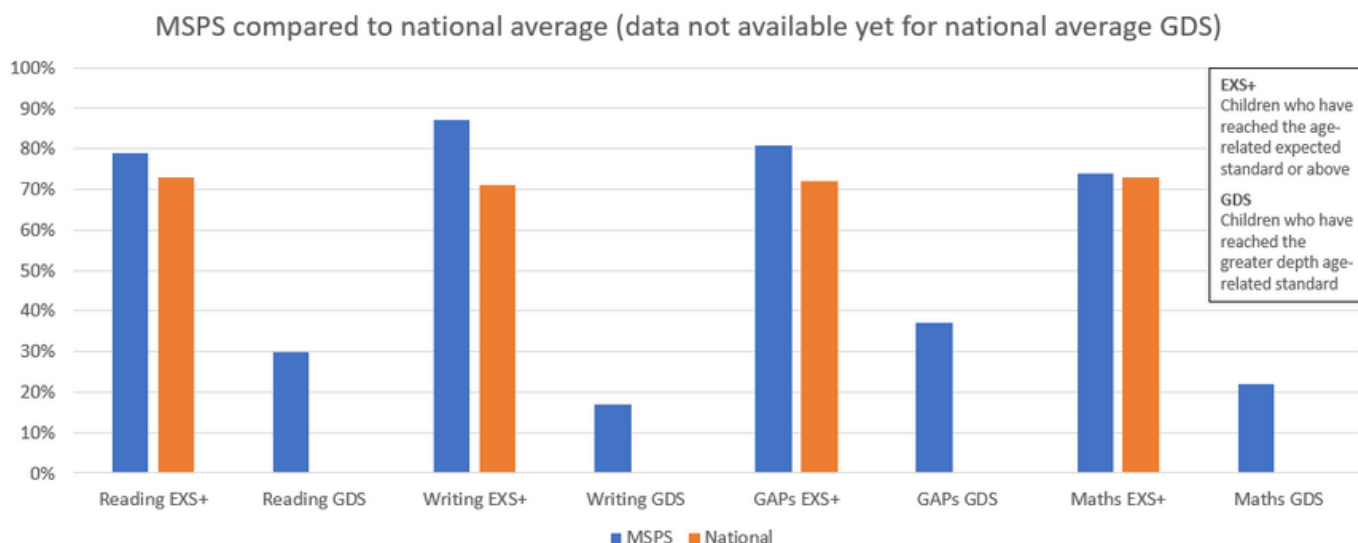
Amazing end of year results!

The answer, put simply, is, "Brilliantly!"

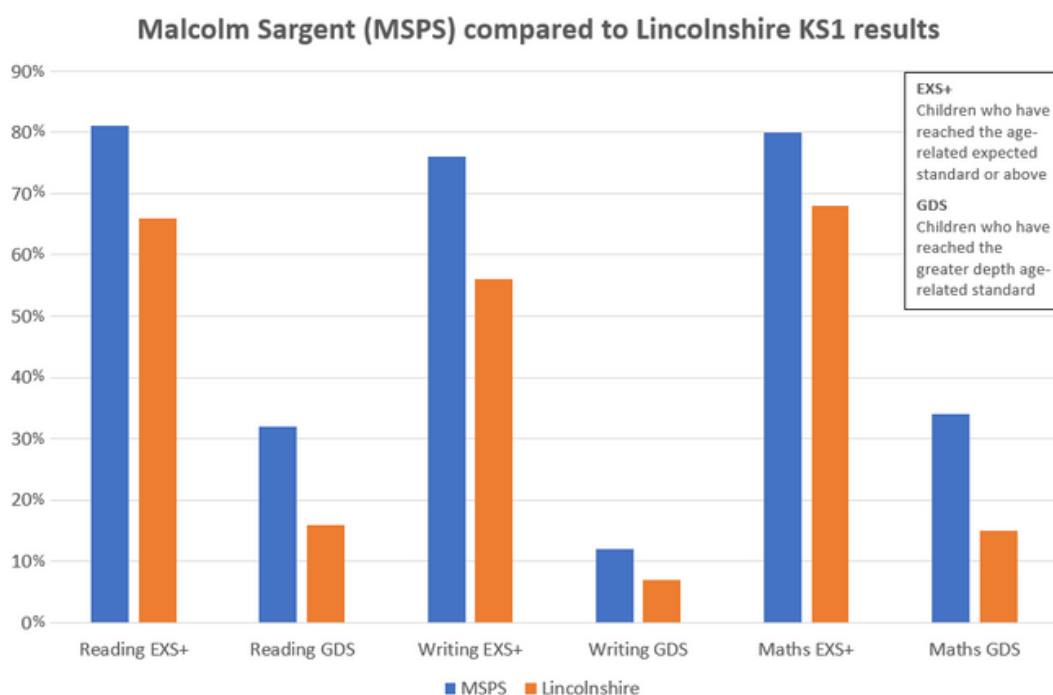
We've tried to keep the data as simple as possible. See below graphs showing:

- 5) EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) results compared to all Lincolnshire schools.

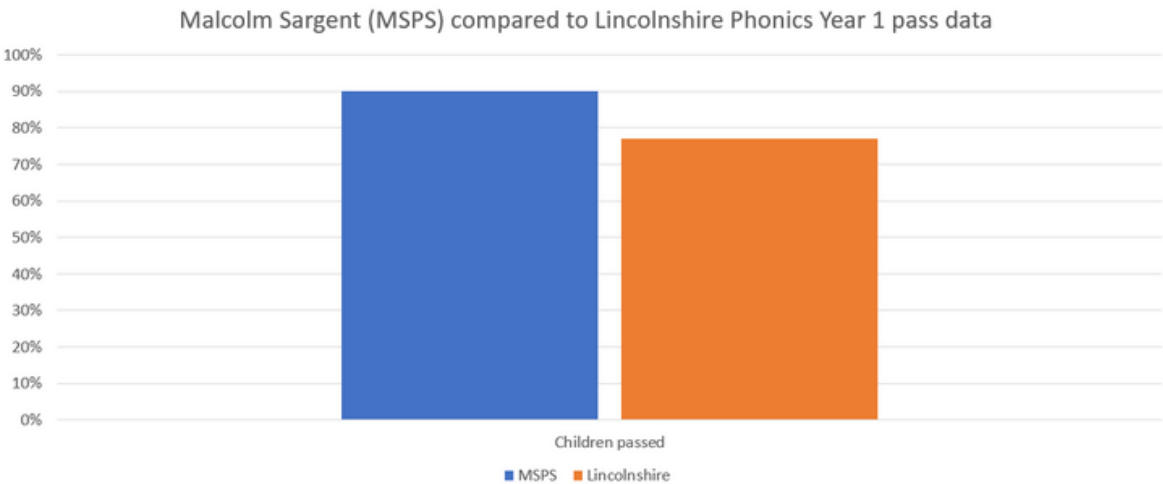
1) KS2 SATS results (Year 6)



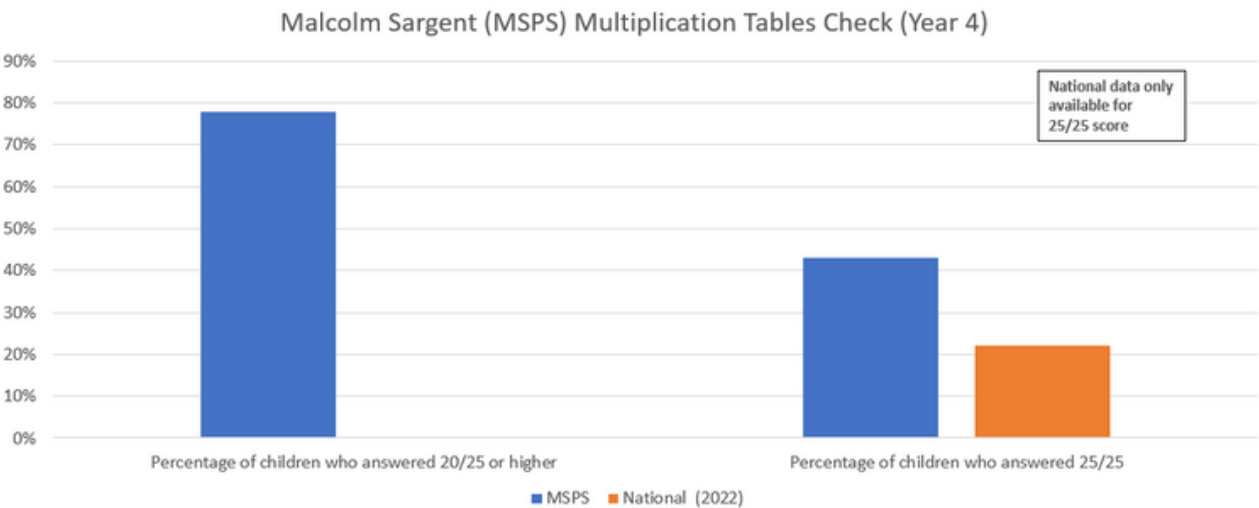
2) KS1 SATS results (Year 2)



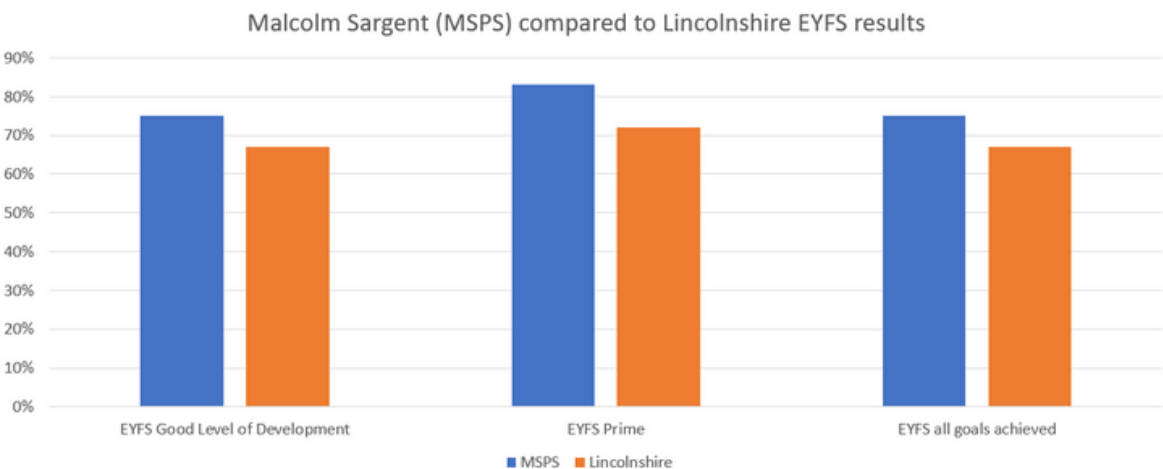
