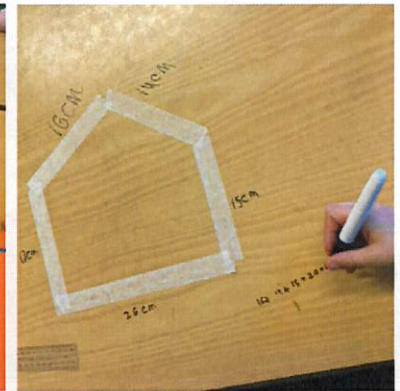
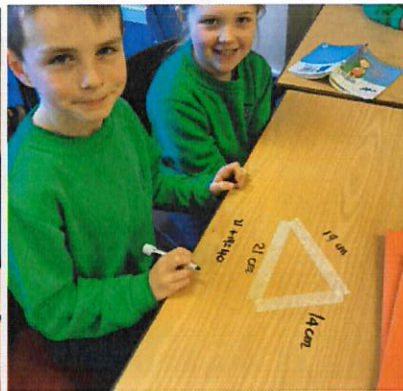
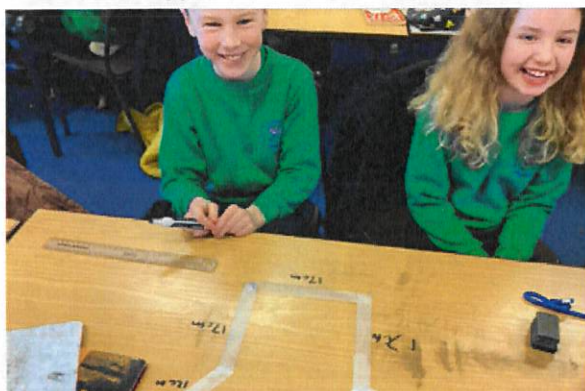
## Chinese New Year celebrations for Foundation Stage

## Year 1 explore clay in art

In art this term, our Year 1 children have been learning to make clay houses.

They were developing their skills of rolling, cutting and making gentle indentations into the surface before letting it dry. They then showed their understanding of colour when they painted them.





## **"On Our Doorstep" topic is a hit for the Foundation Stage children**

The topic 'On our Doorstep' is always so much fun for our youngest pupils because they not only think about their own houses and those of their friends and families, but they also explore our local area to understand how buildings are made. We have been delighted to welcome visitors, such as Dan the carpenter from Part B (a local fire-engineering company) as well as going on a walk taking in the local sights and a bus trip exploring even further afield.

Children learnt about working safely from Dan the carpenter and how to construct an internal wall using power tools. They also built their own structures from foam blocks and re-created the buildings they spotted on their walk and bus trip by using junk materials.

## Year 5 children learn about Sikhism in RE

## Children recreate the Stone Age Skara Brae village in Lego

Year 3 pupils have really enjoyed studying the Stone Age, in particular the Neolithic Period and the Skara Brae village which was discovered on the Isle of Orkney. They recreated the village using Lego which deepened their knowledge and allowed them to see visual representations of what they had been studying.



## Green Team set up a wormery and make treats for the birds!

Lewis from Project Abundance helped our Green Team set up a wormery in our Sanctuary at the bottom of the field. This will not only act as a terrific science resource for the entire school but also provide a continuous supply of organic fertiliser for our allotments and plants. Lewis kindly supplied the horse manure, tiger worms, straw and cardboard. A huge thank you to Lewis from Project Abundance in Peterborough and Mrs (Dorothea) Mills who organised and ran this inspiring activity. The Green Team also made fat balls to hang on trees, providing food for birds during a time when food can be scarce for them during the winter months.

## Michelin-starred chef visits Year 3 pupils

Aaron Patterson, local Michelin-starred chef at Hambleton Hall in Rutland, visited our Year 3 pupils as part of the DT topic 'Eating Seasonally'. He displayed menus from different times of the year and discussed how the ingredients change across seasons. He also brought in ingredients for the children to touch and smell, all of which had been grown in the kitchen gardens at Hambleton Hall. Mr Patterson also showed the children how to handle and chop food safely.



## Road safety visit for Year 1 from Mrs Hutchinson

Mrs Hutchinson, who is our fantastic Road Crossing Patrol Person, visited Year 1 pupils to talk to them about road safety which linked to the PSHE sessions about keeping safe and healthy.

They were told how to look and listen for traffic, choose a safe place to cross and make sure they are with a trusted adult before crossing a road.



## Local artist inspires Foundation pupils

Naomi, a local artist who specialises in drawing iconic Stamford buildings, visited our Foundation Stage children to teach them how to draw buildings. It was great for the pupils to learn artistic techniques, to recognise local landmarks from Naomi's drawings and to draw their own buildings!

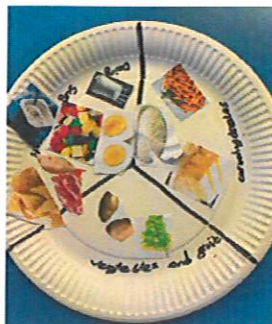




## Year 3 learn about food and their bodies in Science

The pupils in Year 3 made their own 'Eat Well' plates after learning about different food groups and which foods are in each group. They learnt what each food group does to our bodies and how important it is to have a balanced diet which includes all food groups.

They also learnt which foods we should have 'more of' and 'less of' to keep our bodies and minds healthy.



## Local nurse talks to Year 2 about modern hospitals

If any parents in Year 2 wondered why their child came out of school wearing medical examination gloves, it was because Debbie, a fantastic local nurse, came into school to talk to the pupils about modern day nursing! This linked with their history topic about Victorian nurses (including Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale) and including comparing how hospitals and patient care differs from Victorian times to the present day.

We jumped at the chance to be involved in a local Easter Egg Trail organised by South Kesteven District Council's Art and Cultural Services Team! On Saturday 6th April, collect a trail sheet between 11am and 3pm. If you manage to spot all of the eggs and solve the puzzles, participants can return to the starting point to receive a sweetie reward. Thank you to all of our parents with their support in making sure their child has good attendance. Just one day's learning missed can affect a child's understanding of a particular concept or topic.

We are delighted to have been awarded this award for being in the top 10% of FFT schools nationally for our attendance!

## When to keep your child at home if they are unwell...

We know how important attendance of school is for children. However, there are, of course, times when they should be kept at home if they are unwell. Some parents may be unsure when they should send their children to school if they are under the weather. The NHS has a really handy guide on this which can be accessed through this QR code.

We have some children currently in school who are immuno-suppressed, usually through severe illness. Of course, we talk to the other children who are in contact with them, and we take all the usual precautions against the spread of bacteria/viruses with enhanced cleaning routines and encouraging good hygiene with all the children.

It's critical that you inform our office team if your child is diagnosed by a medical professional with any illness such as chickenpox, shingles, measles, flu, tonsillitis, covid etc so that they can share this vitally important information with parents. Thank you so much for your support with this.







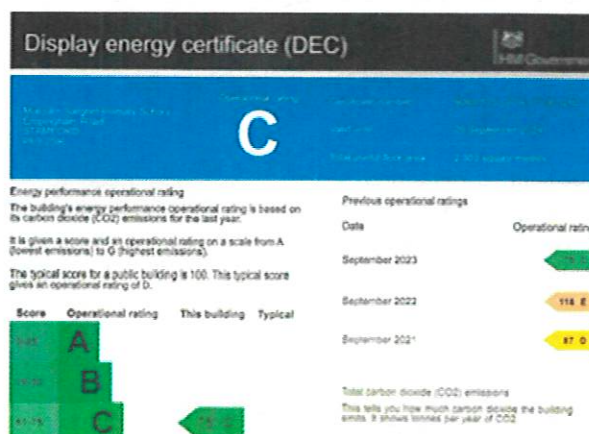
## Staff Quiz Night raises money for charity

## DEC Rating improvement from E to C!

Our DEC (Display Energy Certificate) rating has made significant improvement from our previous rating of E to a much better rating of C. This is due to improvements to energy efficiency made across the school, educating children on the use of energy but mainly due to the hard work of our wonderful Site Manager, Mr Wallace.

Further consideration is being given to solar panels, new heating systems and other green initiatives!

### Trophies at a soggy cross country event!

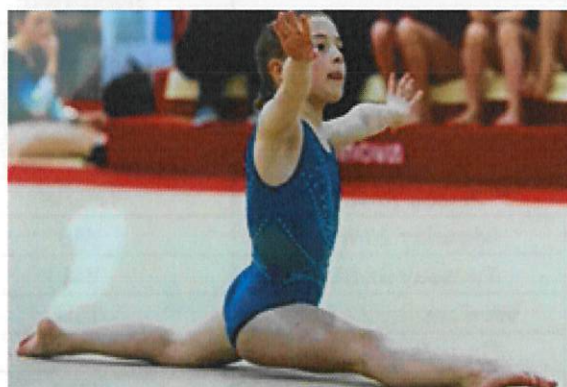

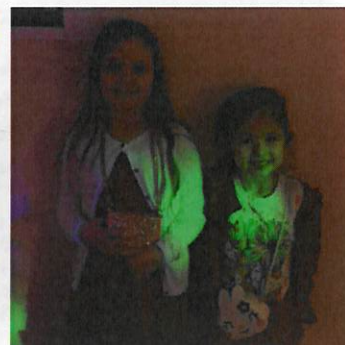
# PTFA Update

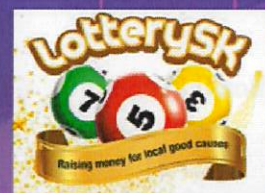
